



## JCCP News Update – February 2017

The JCCP would like to update the many stakeholders and interested parties in the aesthetics industry on its progress. During 2016 the JCCP led by Interim Chair – Professor David Sines, CBE has been consulting widely across the aesthetics industry to assess the appetite for the establishment of a new self-regulatory body.

Consultation has been held with a wide range of stakeholder groups including:

- Government Departments
- Statutory Regulatory Bodies – GMC, NMC, GDC, GphC, HCPC
- Professional Associations and Industry Groups – BACN, BCAM, BAAPS, BAPRAS, HABIA
- Education and Training Providers
- OFQUAL – Qualifications Regulator
- Product and Service Suppliers
- Insurers and Indemnifiers
- Individual aesthetic businesses

The outcome of this consultation and the ‘face to face’ meetings that have been held have evidenced agreement on the need for:

- The establishment and implementation of an agreed set of educational, clinical and practice standards.
- The establishment of an independent ‘not for profit’ Council to operate a voluntary ‘Register’ of practitioners that is accessible to the public with the prime aim of promoting patient safety.
- The establishment of a register of approved education and training providers that offer education, training and approved qualifications that meet the agreed JCCP, CPSA and HEE framework of standards.

To move things forward the following key deliverables have been put in place:

- The establishment of a separate and independent body to develop the clinical and practice based standards for the industry – now up and running and called the ‘Cosmetic Practice Standards Authority (CPSA) with representation across both medical and non-medical practitioner groups.

- The establishment of a series of Working Parties to assist with the design and development of the JCCP:
  - Education, Training and Accreditation – Chair - Dr. Anne Mcnall
  - Register – Chair – Professor Mary Lovegrove, OBE
  - Aesthetic Practitioners – Chair – Caroline Larrissey (HABIA)
- An interim governance body called the ‘JCCP Strategic Development Group’ to oversee the overall process – Chair – Professor David Sines.

These groups are now operational with broad representation and with key targets and tasks to achieve (a list of people and organisations participating in these groups is available on request from the JCCP).

The JCCP is also in the process of seeking ‘Expressions of Interest’ with regard to the establishment and management of a technology platform for the operational delivery of its registers.

The JCCP will progress later this year with an agreed constitution, memorandum and articles of association, governance frameworks and a permanent staffing structure.
